READING & ROLLING

When the hi-hat is omitted, as it most often is, either don't play it, or play it at any time you feel it's comfortable and appropriate. Also, feel free to divide the snare part between the snare, tom-toms and cymbals, as you see fit.

All metronome indications are approximations that should be considered optional. Not every page has a metronome marking – some just indicate moderate or fast, etc.

IMPORTANT: At the corner, on the bottom of each page is the approximate time I feel it should take to play that page after the music has been thoroughly developed. As previously stated, some readers will be able to complete the page in a faster time, while others may need a few extra seconds, or even longer.

NOTE: The hi-hat part is marked with an X, and usually placed on the stem of the bass part. However, it's mostly not indicated at all, in which case the reader can once again incorporate it as he or she sees fit. In several places, however, especially when the reading is focused on rock or jazz coordination, there is a fourth leger line above or below the bass specifically for the hi-hat part.
