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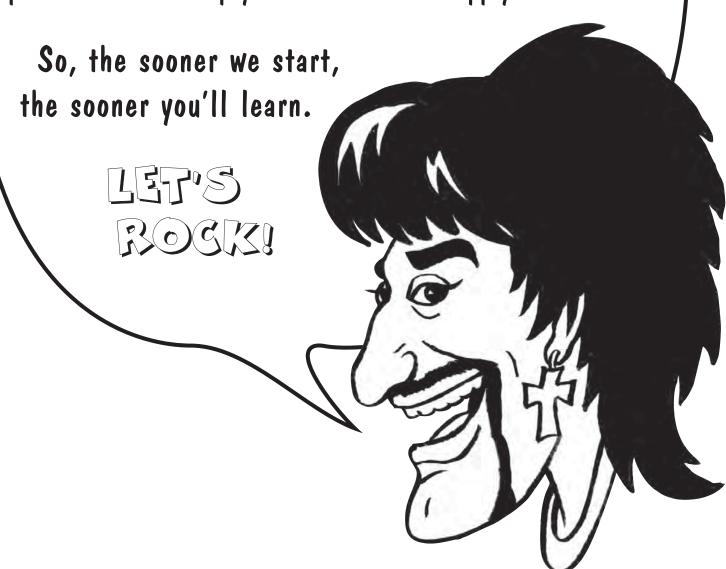
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Hi, my name is **Carmine Appice**, and welcome to

THE BASICS

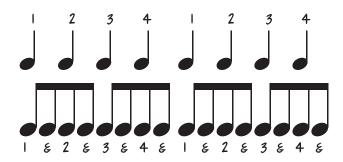
Here are the note and rest values used in this book:

Quarter notes = one beat = quarter-note rest Eighth notes = half of a beat = eighth-note rest **COUNTING:** We use numbers when we count each note.

The quarter notes have a different count from the eighth notes.

Count each quarter note with each number: 1, 2, 3, 4.

With the eighth-note count, you will notice an "&" between each number: 1 & 2 & 3 & 4 &. On CD 1, I will play an example of quarter and eighth notes and will count them for you.



RESTS: When you see a rest ₹, it means you should "say it" and not "play it." **Example:** If we want to rest on number 2 and play numbers 1, 3, 4, it would look like this:

1 REST 3 4. As you can see, you leave out beat 2 and tap beats 1, 3, 4.

A MEASURE or BAR: A measure is a total of four beats counted 1, 2, 3, 4.

MUSIC LINES: For most of the book, there are three lines

LINE 0 is the TOM-TOM.

LINE 1 is the HI-HAT (HH).

LINE 2 is the SNARE DRUM (SD).

LINE 3 is the BASS DRUM (BD).

Here is what they look like:

ETGITH-NOTE GROOVES

Next we will play eighth notes between our hands and feet. These notes are counted 1 & 2 & 3 & 4 &. Listen to the CD for help.

I've written out nine exercises with two repeat marks for each pattern.

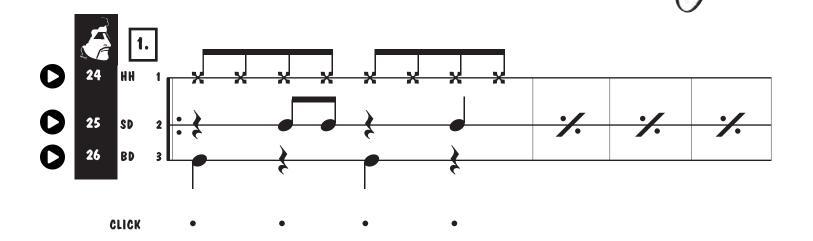
Play each beat over and over, and pay attention to the eighth-note rests.

One more thing: On the CD there is a click to help you with the tempo.

I'll play along with you. After I play for four bars with the click, the click will keep playing, and that's where you play along with it.

I will be counting along with each exercise.
